Rationale	Caribbean PDBs play a crucial role in promoting and fostering gender equitable finance, as well as climate finance in the region. They can receive technical assistance (TA) from donors, MDBs, expert groups and international organizations in order to increase gender and climate mainsreaming within their institutions and across their	
	investments. This session will discuss how this TA works in practice, how PDBs benefit from the existing TA, and their future requirements for gender and climate-related TA, inclduing with regards to measuring progress.	
	This session relates to the Summit's main topics of SME and financial inclusion, as Financial and non-financial solutions developed by PDBs to improve access to financing for women owned SMEs. It also covers the toic of PDB's institutionnal agenda, as TA supports banks in achieving a sustainable transformation.

	 What have been your experiences with TA? How do you aim to maximize its use to your advantage? What models, such as on-demand TA facilities, have worked well? In the areas of climate and gender, what TA has been useful and what more is needed? How much effort and allocation of resources does an institution require to apply for TA? How do NDBs internally manage and coordinate the process after TA has been granted? How do you determine your TA needs and how can partners and TA providers better respond? How can NDBs maximize the impact of the received TA? How can impact measurement and management practices, tools and TA be integrated into TA on other thematic areas such as climate and gender? (UNDP) Have NDBs identified any needs to mainstream gender or improve capacity in climate within your institution that could be filled by TA? We have seen that a number of national DBs have attempted to take the first step to mainstreaming gender within institution in the past. However, we have increasingly seen development banks approach us to revise existing gender policies. Why is it that development banks are revising their gender policies at this point in time? What convinces NDBs on the importance of working on gender? How does TA support NDBs to reach their strategic objectives for climate adaptation and/or mitigation?
